In a year marked by unexpected challenges, Goodwill Industries of Central Alabama (GICA) was still able to provide training, employment, and placement services for people with disabilities. Despite the disruption caused by the COVID Pandemic the revenue from our retail stores and government contract services provided jobs at Goodwill for over 150 people with disabilities. This year we are especially grateful for the generous donations of clothing and household goods that continued to come in despite the restrictions and service limitations caused by COVID. The COVID outbreak has also forced us to evaluate how we provide services to the community. In cooperation with the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services (ADRS) we are exploring virtual options for services delivery. Goodwill is purchasing technology to provide virtual Smart Work Ethics training to high school students and prison inmates. Additionally, in the future we expect to restart Vocational College Tours, Workplace Tours, and Summer Job Exploration Work for high school students. Of course, none of what we do would be possible without the generosity of our donors, and the loyalty, dedication, and hard work of our employees. 

Tom "Red" Perry was in a car accident in 2001. He suffered a spinal cord injury that left him paralyzed from the waist down. When Red first had the accident he felt depressed and overwhelmed. He worked hard to overcome those feelings and instead have a positive, upbeat attitude on life. Red has been working for Goodwill a little over two years. He works at the Eastern Boulevard retail store. The state has provided Red with an electric wheelchair to use while he is working at the store. The chair allows him to take on larger tasks at work. He enjoys greeting donors, collecting donations and helping his team members.
