Goodwill Industries was founded in 1902 in Boston by the Rev. Edgar Helms. Helms collected used household goods and clothing in wealthier areas of the city and hired people in need to prepare the goods for resale. The system worked, and 120 years later, there are 155 autonomous local Goodwill agencies in the United States and Canada. Goodwill agencies today focus on helping people with disabilities or other barriers find employment. The results are impressive: In 2021, more than 123,000 people were placed in jobs and 2 million received job services. Goodwill Industries of Central Alabama is a proud member of the Goodwill network of autonomous, nonprofit corporations. We are providing employment and placement services for people with disabilities, Smart Work Ethics training, and vocational tours for high school students. Vouchers are also given to individuals needing help because of personal emergencies caused by fires or floods. All is made possible because of the generosity of our donors and the dedication and hard work of our employees. We thank you all for your continued support.

He works at the Eastern Boulevard retail store. The state has provided Red with an electric wheelchair to use while he is working at the store. The chair allows him to take on larger tasks at work. He enjoys greeting donors, collecting donations and helping his team members.
